Reading Club programs, Family Programs, One City/ One Book events, Read TO Succeed programs and furnishings, movie and music programs, and the

purchase of two additional Early Literacy Workstations. Income was augmented by Endowment Fund contributions, daily book sales, the bi-annual book sale, book rentals, online sales, membership dues, the Autry Museum tour, and the sale of OCOB books at the Author event. Founded in 1994 by Robert and Margie Peterson and housed in a unique structure of stainless steel, the Peterson Auto Museum is among the largest museums of its kind, comprising over



100 vehicles displayed among its 25 galleries. The collection includes such exhibits as Steve McQueen's 1956 Jaguar XKSS, the James Bond *Skyfall* 1964 Aston Martin DB5, the 1992 Batmobile from *Batman Returns* and Elvis Presley's De Tomaso Pantera.
