The Autry is the perfect place to learn about the American West. - Regular used book sale hours: 6:00-8:30 pm Friday and 10:00-3:00 Saturday, October 21st.



One City One Book

The 2017 One City One Book selection is *News of the World*, a National Book Award Finalist for fiction by Paulette Jiles. It is 1870 and Captain Jefferson Kyle Kidd travels through Texas, giving live readings to paying audiences hungry for news of the world. In Wichita Falls, Kidd is offered a reward for delivering a young orphan to her relatives in San Antonio, a 400-mile trek through unsettled territory. This is their story.

OCOB kicks off Saturday, October 1 at the GRB Library with a musical performance by **Ponderosa Acres**, accompanied by lessons in line dancing and a ride in a Wells Fargo Stagecoach. A number of events follow throughout the month of October, featuring:
