Thank you to the many FTOL volunteers who worked to make our August pop-up sale a great success. This sale was much larger than our previous pop-up sales with the \$5/bag portion including CDs and DVDs as well as paperback books. The community response was excellent thanks to the publicity on our website, Facebook, NextDoor

and the Acorn newspaper.

Despite a year of many changes including the expanded daily book sale spaces in both libraries, the relocation of TO sorting and searching spaces and the introduction of pop-up sales in place of the semi-annual "big" sales, the coming year is shaping up to be more of the same. For example, the TO library daily sales area is being revamped to increase the children's book area, increase and alphabetize the DVD area, reorganize the fiction and non-fiction areas, and generally increase the inventory of items available to the public. The FTOL and the Library are also working on plans to relocate the FTOL sorting and searching space currently upstairs at the NP library to a section

of the old technical services area downstairs.

All of these changes demand large commitments of time and energy by FTOL volunteers. Consequently, the final pop-up sale for 2019 originally scheduled for November 9th is cancelled to allow our volunteers time to focus on completing and adapting to these changes. Going forward we shall be looking for opportunities to stage "flash" sales in conjunction with events or programs at the libraries. These sales will be of limited size and narrowly focused consistent with the events/programs to which they are linked. The Children's Overstock Sale that was held at the Thousand Oaks Library on September 21st was one such sale. We will have a booth at the Rotary Club Street Fair on Sunday October 20th to promote the FTOL to the community and to recruit new members and volunteers.



Book Sales Updates

Where Does the Money Go?



Some of you may wonder what happens to the money that FTOL earns through their online sales or daily sales. At the Friend's September Board meeting earlier this week, Charlotte Burrows, the Children's Library Supervisor gave us a presentation of all the Children's programs that made use of

FTOL funds. The summer program is always a big success and this year was no different with over 3,700 kids signed up for the program. The

Library reported over 5,560 community members attended their summer events at the Library and over 1,200 at various out-reach events in the community. FTOL is a major contributor to that success.

Two other recent innovations at the Library include the newly created Teen Space. If you haven't seen it yet, you should stop by and check it out – it's a great hang-out, do homework, socialize in a safe place for our community teens and FTOL makes regular contributions to Teen programs that will be held there. The second cool addition, in part thanks to FTOL funds, is the new podcast room at the library that can be used by patrons interested in creating their own podcasts!

You can see the funds FTOL donates are used in a variety of ways at the Library to help serve our community and foster literacy. You should all be proud as members of the Friends to be a part of it!

News from Daily Sales and A Call for Volunteers

As some of you are aware, we've been going through some reorganization at the Thousand Oaks Library over the last few months. The end is in sight thanks to the tireless efforts of Jessie Fowler and her team. The Fiction hardcovers, paperbacks and trades are all interfiled, the non-fiction have been reworked adding several new categories and subcategories to make it eas-

ier for our patrons to find things. The Children's area, DVDs and Bargain Books have also been expanded and many other sections reorganized and improved with subcategories and shelf labels. Thanks to all who helped. We aren't quite done, but we've gotten plenty of positive reviews from patrons. We also have some new signage to help direct people and a new price list.

Newbury Park Library is starting their own reorganization due to a move of their sorting room. The team is taking full advantage of it to reorganize their shelves, prioritize their backlog and purge some older stuff that just doesn't sell. They will have bargain shelves for hard cover fiction, trade fiction and paperback fiction as well as bargain non-fiction shelves and a special section for newer non-fiction books. All of the shelves have new shelf labels to make things easier to find. We've just gotten underway with the changes, but everyone is getting behind the effort and hopefully their patrons will appreciate their improved space. Thanks to Susan Bullard and her team at Newbury Park.

And finally, if any you FTOL members are interested in volunteering with us, either at the Library in our Book Sales group, or in other ways, we have several other initiatives the Board wants to undertake, but we need some assistance from our members to make them happen. These initiatives range from:

- making presentations about FTOL at local community groups.
- helping coordinate our cultural bus tours.
- assisting with our new Overstock sales (a mini-book sale).
- coordinating additional awareness efforts to help grow our FTOL group and the services we can offer to our Thousand Oaks community.

If you have any interest, just let us know and we'd be happy to discuss all of the various initiatives with you.


