The disruption of the Friends' sorting and searching capabilities at the Newbury Park Library has not ended but has temporarily ceased. Though there may be future disruptions due to further renovation of the facility our activity has returned to a more normal state, and overstock and cart sales are being considered going forward.

We are now well into preparations for our next big event, the Open House, at the Thousand Oaks Library on February 8th 1-4 PM. This event calls attention to the newly named Friends' Bookshop in the Thousand Oaks Library as well as to the materials, services, and programs provided to the community by the Library which are funded by the Friends.

With the continuous advances in technology for downloading of digitized books, movies, and music via the internet, the Friends must consider the possibility that revenue from the sale of books, DVDs, and CDs may be significantly reduced over time. Fortunately, adaptation of such technological advances takes place slowly, and FTOL's financial position and revenue streams remain strong thanks to the efforts of our dedicated volunteers. Because we would rather be proactive than reactive to any changes in our situation, investigation of potential new sources of revenue while maximizing revenue from current sources is prudent. To that end the organization is committed to developing and executing a strategic plan to do just that.

## **Library Statistics for 2018-2019**

- The Library was open 5309 hours in 2018.
- 58.099 people have a TOL library card
- 1,008,681 people came through our doors in 2018-2019.
- The TOL library website had 2,254,000 visitors
- In-library use totaled 153,352.
- The TOL collection contained 433,490 items.
- There were 98,868 downloads of e-content.

- There were 847,754 checkouts.
- We lent our items to libraries outside our system 253 times.
- We had 39 dedicated full-time staff.
- 60,162 reference questions were asked.
- There were 577 items brought in by patron request.
- There were 971 total programs offered, with a total of 35,073 people attending.
