Frol President this together". That is certainly true for the Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library (FTOL), as we adjust to the closure of the Thousand Oaks and the Newbury Park libraries.

Though the libraries are closed, library services to the community have not ended. Online access to programs and information provided by the libraries continues and has been enhanced. Ebooks are available over the internet via the OverDrive (Libbey) application, and the "Virtual Library" application provides access to many other information resources. The aquarium and "the denizens of the deep" are still being cared for.

FTOL funds these and many other materials, programs and services (during "normal" times) primarily by selling donations from the public in our Bookshops and online to raise money. The closure of the libraries has meant the loss of revenue from our Bookshops and other in-library sales. Because donations are not

being accepted during the closure, the inventory for online sales is not increasing, and sales are decreasing. All of this means that FTOL is severely hampered in its ability to raise funds to support the Library.

There is no time-certain for FTOL to resume its "normal" processing of donations. It is not clear what the "new normal" for handling donations will be when the libraries reopen. FTOL volunteers are committed to supporting the Thousand Oaks Library and the Newbury Park Library going forward by whatever means we can. We hope that our members will remain equally committed to ensure that we keep our libraries awesome. We are all in this together. NB: Effective May 27th, the GRB Library is receiving books checked out prior to the quarantine and offering curbside check-out. Please see the library website for further updates.
