



Thousand Oaks Reads 2020 / One City One Book The Honey Bus, by Meredith May



Since 2007, the Thousand Oaks Library's Thousand Oaks Reads: One City One Book program has served as the community's signature literary event. This year's title was announced in January, Meredith May's The Honey Bus, an unforgettable story about finding home in the most unusual of places, and how a tiny, little-understood

insect could save a life. The OCOB program comprises book club discussions, musical presentations, lectures and other related activities leading up to the author event in April, 2020 - the finale of National Library Week.
