The Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library owes a huge debt of gratitude to Dan Ruth, editor of this FOCUS newsletter for the past several years. Dan has resigned from his position as editor. He performed his duties as editor quietly, efficiently and competently. Though he will continue

to support FTOL as a volunteer, his contribution as FOCUS editor comes to an end with this issue.

This year we have all had to adapt and accept chang-

es to our daily lives brought on by the Covid 19 pandemic. A change that is forced on us is a challenge to our ability to adapt. When the libraries closed, stopped taking in donations, and shuttered our Bookshops, we were forced to adapt. Our Book Sales VP, Janet Doman, with her team of dedicated volunteers was accepting donations by appointment (regrettably, we have had to temporarily stop accepting donations), store and process them at her home, distribute them to our online sellers, and supply local non-profit organizations with requested books. Consequently, we have succeeded in partially restoring our revenue stream while also continuing our support of other community organizations.

Though we have currently stopped accepting donations, we continue to have substantial inventory, and with our Bookshops shuttered, we have begun implementation of an online store to offer items for sale to the local community that in non-Covid times would be sold in our Friends' Bookshops. Purchases from our online store will be available for pick-up as described on the website (https://www.shopftol.org). We hope to continue offering items for sale to the local community via this online outlet even after our Bookshops once again open for business.

Though his resignation as newsletter editor has forced us to find a replacement, Dan has suggested that now may be the time for format and content changes to update its look and feel. While it is necessary to make some changes in response to the dual challenges presented by the Covid-19 pandemic and Dan's resignation, what is not changing is our commitment to fulfill our mission to support the Library.



FTOL Endowment Offers Long-lasting Support for the Library

Did you know that the FTOL Endowment Fund is celebrating its 25th Anniversary? The Endowment Fund was first announced April 22, 1995 with an initial contribution of \$15,000 from the Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library. The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to

purchase books and other materials using interest and dividends from the Fund. The Friends provide the money to the Library staff each year and they select and order materials to meet community needs. The amount provided to the Library varies each year, but it has reached \$4500.

By giving to this Fund, you are giving to the community and ensuring that year after year, new materials flow into the Thousand Oaks and Newbury Park libraries.

You are probably wondering how much is in the fund now. The number is just over \$126,000 this year. You can help reach \$150,000 in celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the Endowment Fund by giving by the end of the year.

The Fish at the Library Miss Us While the Library is Closed

Do you miss seeing the colorful tropical fish in the HUGE Library aquarium? They peacefully swim around and around everyday looking for just a little excitement between feeding times. I am certain they miss the constant stream of Library visitors stopping by to enjoy their shapes, colors and swim antics. Many of you have noticed the Fish Friday videos posted for our viewing pleasure on Facebook by the Library Staff. Even during COVID times, these fish continue to provide us with joy.



Spring 2006 The Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library annually finance just over \$10,000 of the total costs to maintain the aquarium you enjoy. Periodically, algae and other bad actors are purged from the 3600gallon saltwater tank and of course, there is regular feeding, care, and occasional replacement of the tropical fish who make the Library their home.

About the Aquarium From the Archives

The large saltwater aquarium was installed in February 2006 as a gift from the Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library to celebrate the expansion of the Library with the new Children's Wing which opened later that year. The aquarium at that time cost nearly \$104,000. It is 18.9 feet

long, 5 feet tall and 5 feet wide and is constructed of Plexiglass that is over an inch thick. From the grand opening of the Children's Wing on it continues to be one of the most visited portions of the Library strategically placed between the Children's Wing and the Main Library. Initially, the Friends raised funds from



the community with a large \$20,000 donation coming from Hussam Yacoub, owner of AKG Construction, the Library expansion project contractor and his family. Bob Morrison financed the signage for the aquarium and many of you contributed.

The aquarium contractor was Fish By Design Aquarists, led by Raul Valentini. The aquarium was delivered on a large flatbed truck with the coral reef structure already installed inside the tank. The coral reef is made of plastic polymer and took 2 weeks to construct. Unloading the aquarium from the truck took nearly four hours. The Friends presented the City of Thousand Oaks with the BIG check and on April 4, 2006, the Thousand Oaks City Council presented a Commendation in honor of the Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library to thank the Friends for the gift of the saltwater aquarium. The grand opening for the Children's Wing was celebrated June 24, 2006. Since then, the fish in the aquarium have entranced us all.

The tropical fish are doing well even without their regular stream of visitors to entertain. They continue to swim in and around their coral reef, but not without regular care and attention from trained professionals.


